Undocumented Students Resource Project Proposal

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Objective: to collaborate with appropriate College constituencies in order to research, develop, fund, and implement a program that supports undocumented students with access to essential information that provides a clearer pathway to graduation as well as trained faculty and staff advocates/"allies" at Brookdale.

Background in brief: DACA and undocumented students navigate higher education with additional barriers to their success. While facing the statistical "success gap," DACA and undocumented students face an "opportunity gap," where certain educational, financial, and other resources and opportunities are not attainable due to a variety of factors regarding their status.

Factors Affecting Educational Success of Undocumented Students

Challenges to High School and College Success

- Legal and financial barriers
- Family poverty/work and family demands
- Uncertainty about future
- Lack of college information/guidance
- Lack of family understanding/support
- Psychological and emotional stresses
- Limited English proficiency/low educational attainment


Keys to High School and College Success

- · Financial support for college
- Parental support
- Trusting relationships with instructors and counselors
- Peer mentors
- Access to information about postsecondary options
- · Lower levels of family responsibility
- Psychological resilience, perseverance, optimism

Brookdale can mitigate these barriers by implementing recommendations articulated by the following organizations:

 - o Colleges and universities should "Train advisors and other college administrators to properly address the needs of undocumented students and to create a more welcoming campus environment"
 - "Expand financial aid opportunities for undocumented students and admit more undocumented students"
- Community College Consortium for Immigrant Education, "<u>Dreaming Big: What Community Colleges Can do to Help Undocumented Immigrant Youth Achieve Their Potential</u>":
 - Develop a coordinated outreach plan with immigrant youth-led organizations, immigrant advocacy coalitions, and other community-based organizations to build trust and help undocumented students learn about accessing the community college system
 - O Strengthen the K-12 pipeline to engage undocumented students, parents, teachers, and counselors and facilitate transition to community college
 - o Recruit undocumented students as community ambassadors and student role models
 - o Develop online sites that promote programs and resources for undocumented students

- o Promote dual enrollment in high school and college courses as a cost-saving college preparation strategy
