

Bachelor of Arts in Business Administration at Rutgers-Brookdale Community College

This advising guide is designed for Prospective Transfer Students from Brookdale Community College. Please contact our office directly for advising guides from other NJ Community Colleges.

For students interested in transferring into the **Bachelor of Arts in Business Administration program at Rutgers-Brookdale**, completion of the following Brookdale Community College courses is **recommended** before enrollment:

- Macroeconomics: ECON105
- Microeconomics: ECON106
- Principles of Accounting I & II: ACCT101+102
 (This is a linked course. Students **must** take both courses in order to receive credit for Financial Accounting (52:010:101) at Rutgers University.)
- Statistics: ECON225 OR MATH131.
- Business Calculus: MATH176. Students are strongly encouraged to take this course while at Brookdale. Students may also take this course online at Rutgers University provided they have completed MATH156 or 153 at BCC.
Important Note: Students who may also apply to the Rutgers Business School in New Brunswick **must** take MATH171 instead. RBS-New Brunswick requires that this course be completed as part of the associate degree.
- Intro to Computers: COMP129.
Important Note: Students who may also apply to the Rutgers Business School in New Brunswick **must** also take either COMP126 or COMP128.
- Business Law: BUSI221. This course is recommended, but *not* required for admissions.

The above courses should be completed as part of or in addition to an Associate Degree program. **Completion of an Associate in Arts (AA) or Associate in Science (AS) degree is required to be considered for admission.** Students with an AAS or other degrees may not be eligible for this program but should consult with the Manager of Academic Programs at Rutgers-Brookdale prior to applying.

Students may transfer up to 60 credits from a community college to Rutgers-School of Business Camden and must receive a grade of C or better for a course to transfer. Students who have not completed all of the above courses, may be still considered for admission, but should consult with a Rutgers advisor prior to submitting an application. Courses for the Business Administration degree at Rutgers-Brookdale are a combination of courses taught in-class at the Lincroft campus and online courses. Students interested in transferring into this program should be comfortable with taking some online courses.

Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice at Rutgers-Brookdale Community College

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For students interested in transferring into the **Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice at Rutgers-Brookdale**, completion of the following College courses are **highly recommended** before enrollment:

- CRJU 101 (Intro to Criminal Justice) *Required.*
- CRJU 125 (Police Role in the Community)
- CRJU 127 (Intro to Corrections)
- CRJU 151 (Intro to Criminology)
- SOCI 101 (Intro to Sociology)

Important Note: *Tech Prep Credits* earned in high school at the *Academy of Law & Public Safety* do not transfer to Rutgers University. Courses must appear on a college transcript with a letter grade in order to transfer.

The above courses should be completed as part of or in addition to an Associate Degree program. **Completion of an Associate in Arts (AA) or Associate in Science (AS) degree is required to be considered for admission.** Students with an AAS or other degrees are not be eligible for this program but should consult with the Manager of Academic Programs at Rutgers-Brookdale to discuss available options.

Students may transfer up to 60 credits from a community college to Rutgers University and must receive a grade of C or better for a course to be transferred in. Students may transfer up to 90 credits from a four year university or college and community college combined. ***The School of Arts and Sciences does not accept community college credits for courses taken after an Associate Degree is awarded.***

Courses for the Criminal Justice degree at Rutgers-Brookdale are a combination of courses taught in-class at the Lincroft campus and online courses. Students interested in transferring into this program should be comfortable with taking some online and hybrid courses.

A Minor is required for this program.

School of Arts and Sciences majors require three years of college prep math in High school (Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II).

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Bachelor of Arts in Journalism at Rutgers-Brookdale Community College

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For students interested in transferring into the **Bachelor of Arts in Journalism program at Rutgers-Brookdale**, completion of the following Brookdale Community College courses are **recommended** before enrollment:

- COMM 101 (Communication I) – *required*
- COMM 102 (Communication II) – *required*
- Recommended to complete 3 of the following:
 - COMM 226
 - PHTY 105, 111, 120, 212, or 225
 - RDIO 101
 - TELV 121, 122, or 224

The above courses should be completed as part of or in addition to an Associate Degree program. **Completion of an Associate in Arts (AA) or Associate in Science (AS) degree is required to be considered for admission.** AAS or AFA degrees are **not** eligible for admission to this degree program. The AA in Journalism or Media Studies is the recommended Associate Degree program at Brookdale CC which includes most of the above courses as part of that program. *Students with other degrees may be able to apply to this program but should consult with the Manager of Academic Programs at Rutgers-Brookdale prior to applying.*

Students may transfer up to 60 credits from a community college to Rutgers Newark-University College and must receive a grade of C or better for a course to be transferred in. Students may transfer up to 90 credits from a four-year university or college and community college combined.

Courses for the Journalism degree at Rutgers-Brookdale are a combination of courses taught in-class at the Lincroft campus and online courses. Students interested in transferring into this program should be comfortable with taking some online and hybrid courses.

A Minor or Off Campus Secondary Concentration is required for this program.

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Bachelor of Science in Labor Studies at Rutgers-Brookdale Community College

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For students interested in transferring into the **Bachelor of Science in Labor and Employment Relations program at Rutgers-Brookdale**, completion of the following Brookdale Community College courses are **recommended** before enrollment:

- MATH 131 (Statistics I)
- SOCI 101 (Intro to Sociology)

The above courses should be completed as part of or in addition to an Associate Degree program. **Completion of an Associate in Arts (AA), Associate in Science (AS), or Associate in Applied Science (AAS) degree is required to be considered for admission.**

Students may transfer up to 60 credits from a community college to Rutgers University and must receive a grade of C or better for a course to be transferred in. Students may transfer up to 90 credits from a four year university or college and community college combined.

Courses for the Labor Studies degree at Rutgers-Brookdale are a combination of courses taught in-class at the Lincroft campus and online courses. Students interested in transferring into this program should be comfortable with taking some online courses.

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Bachelor of Arts in Liberal Studies at Rutgers-Brookdale Community College

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It is recommended, *but not required*, that applicants complete the following courses during the course of their studies at Brookdale Community College:

- MATH136 (Math for Liberal Arts)
 - 2 semesters of any Foreign Language. (NOT including American Sign Language)
 - SOCI101 (Introduction to Sociology)
 - PSYC105 or 106 (Introduction to Psychology)

The above courses should be completed as part of or in addition to an Associate Degree program. **Completion of an Associate in Arts (AA), Associate in Science (AS), or Associate in Applied Science (AAS) degree is required to be considered for admission.**

Students may transfer up to 60 credits from a community college to Rutgers University and must receive a grade of C or better for a course to transfer. Students who have not completed all of the above courses, may be still considered for admission, but should consult with a Rutgers advisor prior to submitting an application.

Courses for the Liberal Studies degree at Rutgers-Brookdale are a combination of courses taught in-class at the Lincroft campus and online courses. Students interested in transferring into this program should be comfortable with taking some online courses.

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Bachelor of Arts in Political Science at Rutgers-Brookdale Community College

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For students interested in transferring into the **Bachelor of Arts in Political Science at Rutgers-Brookdale**, completion of the following College courses are **highly recommended** before enrollment:

- POLI 101 (Intro to Political Science) – *required*
- MATH 136 (Math for the Liberal Arts) – *highly recommended*
- SOCI 101 (Intro to Sociology)
- PSYC105 or 106 (Intro to Psychology)
- 2 semesters of any Foreign Language. – *highly recommended*
(NOT including American Sign Language)

The above courses should be completed as part of or in addition to an Associate Degree program. **Completion of an Associate in Arts (AA) or Associate in Science (AS) degree is required to be considered for admission.** Students with an AAS in Paralegal Studies are eligible to transfer to this program. Students from other AAS degrees may not be eligible for this program and should consult with the Manager of Academic Programs at Rutgers-Brookdale prior to applying.

Students may transfer up to 60 credits from a community college to Rutgers University and must receive a grade of C or better for a course to transfer. Students who have not completed all of the above courses, may be still considered for admission, but should consult with a Rutgers advisor prior to submitting an application.

Courses for the Political Science degree at Rutgers-Brookdale are a combination of courses taught in-class at the Lincroft campus and online courses. Students interested in transferring into this program should be comfortable with taking some online courses.

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Bachelor of Arts in Psychology at Rutgers-Brookdale Community College

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For students interested in transferring into the **Bachelor of Arts in Psychology program at Rutgers-Brookdale**, completion of the following Brookdale Community College courses are **recommended** before enrollment:

- PSYC 105 (Intro to Psychology I)
- PSYC 106 (Intro to Psychology II) – *strongly recommended*
- PSYC 247 (Quantitative Methods in Psychology) – *strongly recommended*

The above courses should be completed as part of or in addition to an Associate Degree program. **Completion of an Associate in Arts (AA) or Associate in Science (AS) degree is required to be considered for admission.** Students with an AAS or other degrees may not be eligible for this program but should consult with the Manager of Academic Programs at Rutgers-Brookdale prior to applying.

Students may transfer up to 60 credits from a community college to Rutgers Newark-University College and must receive a grade of C or better for a course to be transferred in. Students may transfer up to 90 credits from a four-year university or college and community college combined.

Courses for the Psychology degree at Rutgers-Brookdale are a combination of courses taught in-class at the Lincroft campus and online courses. Students interested in transferring into this program should be comfortable with taking some online and hybrid courses.

A Minor or Off Campus Secondary Concentration is required for this program.

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Bachelor of Science in Public Health at Rutgers-Brookdale Community College

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Completion of an Associate in Arts (AA) or Associate in Science (AS) degree is required to be considered for admission. Students with an AAS or other degrees should consult with the Manager of Academic Programs at Rutgers-Brookdale prior to applying. *Note: Will accept up to 25 credits of technical credits from an AAS degree

For students interested in transferring into the Bachelor of Science Public Health program at Rutgers-Brookdale, completion of the following Brookdale Community College courses are required before enrollment:

- One Biology course: BIOL101 (General Biology I) or BIOL111 (Human A&P I) (required)
- One course from the following: CHEM 116 or CHEM 136 (required) As of summer 2014 we can only accept these courses if it is taken in person – CANNOT be taken online.
- MATH 131 (Statistics I) (required)

Students may transfer up to 60 credits from a community college to the Edward J. Bloustein School of Planning and Public Policy and must receive a grade of C or better for a course to be transferred in.

Courses for the Public Health degree at Rutgers-Brookdale are a combination of courses taught in-class at the Lincroft campus and online courses. Students interested in transferring into this program should be comfortable with taking some online and hybrid courses.

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Bachelor of Arts in Social Work at Rutgers-Brookdale Community College

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For students interested in transferring into the **Bachelor of Arts in Social Work program at Rutgers-Brookdale**, completion of the following Brookdale Community College courses are **highly recommended** before enrollment:

- PSYC 106 (Intro to Psychology II) - *required*
- PSYC 111 (Intro to Human Services) **AND** PSYC 212 (Community Agencies & Human Services) – *linked courses*
- PSYC 247 (Quantitative Methods) – *strongly recommended*
- POLI 105 (American National Government)
- SOCI 101 (Intro to Sociology) - *required*
- BIOL 108 (Human Biology) - *strongly recommended*

The above courses should be completed as part of or in addition to an Associate Degree program. **Completion of an Associate in Arts (AA) or Associate in Science (AS) degree is required to be considered for admission.** This was originally designed for students who complete the **AS in Pre-Social Work or AS in Addiction Studies**. *Students completing the AAS in Human Services should be encouraged to complete the AS instead.* **Recent changes in the Rutgers SW curriculum encourages students from other AA degrees (i.e. Social Science) to apply.** Please contact the Rutgers Staff at Brookdale with any questions.

Students may transfer up to 60 credits from a community college to Rutgers Newark-University College and must receive a grade of C or better for a course to be transferred in. Students may transfer up to 90 credits from a four year university or college and community college combined.

Courses for the Social Work degree at Rutgers-Brookdale are a combination of courses taught in-class at the Lincroft campus and online courses. Students interested in transferring into this program should be comfortable with taking some online and hybrid courses.

A Minor or Off Campus Secondary Concentration is required for this program.

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
